

SABA North America Congratulates Judge Mustafa Kasubhai and Amir Ali on their Historic Confirmations

This week, SABA North America celebrates two historic appointments that highlight the continuing progress toward a more diverse and inclusive judiciary.

First, we applaud Judge Mustafa Kasubhai's confirmation to the U.S. District Court for the District of Oregon. Born to Indian immigrants, Judge Kasubhai was the first Muslim American judge to serve on the federal bench as a magistrate judge in 2018. He is now making history again as the first Muslim American and first Asian American judge to be serving on the federal courts in the District of Oregon. Judge Kasubhai's journey, from practicing civil law to his distinguished career on the Oregon Workers' Compensation Board and as a circuit judge, is a testament to his dedication to fairness and justice.
